 - ✓ Mailed to Every Mailbox throughout the City








Council Direction

Key Direction Topics

- Expand on Changing Nature of Downtowns and Economics
- Further address ways to embrace existing eclectic massing and form
- Investigate FAR incentive/requirements outside of Main/State Streets
- Clarify First Street ground level setback









Key Direction Topics Cont.

- Include discussion on shuttles/trolleys
- Update pedestrian bridge graphic and move to earlier implementation phase
- Include language and adjust phasing of First Street streetscape plan
- Update 3D model with more articulation
- Additional graphic and text edits also addressed

- Included graphic example of existing conditions





Existing Downtown Conditions.

- Included FAR incentive examples






Conceptual 2.5 FAR Examples.

- Completes process and allows for implementation of the plan.






