Dear Members of the Los Altos City Council:

I am writing to you in hope that you will strongly consider adopting a safe storage of firearms ordinance in Los Altos. I am not only a resident of Los Alto, but also a trauma surgeon caring for victims of firearm injuries on a daily basis. Sadly many of these wounds are self-inflicted by depressed adolescents and elderly patients who have guns in the home and are mentally impaired. Perhaps the most tragic are children who unknowingly pick up a loaded firearm and injure another child. These injuries and deaths are completely preventable by:

- 1. Storing unloaded firearms in a locked cabinet
- 2. Storing ammunition in a separate, locked cabinet.
