SUMMARY OF COUNCIL ACTIONS
7:00 P.M. – REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING**

Closed Session: The City Council held a Closed Session to discuss existing litigation (Doheny-Vidovich Partners v. City of Los Altos) and labor negotiations with Los Altos Peace Officers Association and Los Altos Municipal Employees Association. No action was taken.

Items for Consideration

1. Council Minutes: The City Council adopted the minutes of the November 19, 2019 Special Meeting, the January 14, 2020 Study Session and Regular Meeting, the February 11, 2020 Regular Meeting and the February 25, 2020 Regular Meeting.
2. Annual Development Impact Fees Report for Fiscal Year 2019: The City Council received the Annual Report on Development Impact Fees for Fiscal Year 2019.
3. Resolution No. 2020-06: Cities Keep It Clean: The City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-06 declaring May 2020 to be “Keep It Clean Santa Clara County” month.
4. Resolution No. 2020-07: Distracted Driving Awareness Month: The City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-07 declaring April 2020 to be “Distracted Driving Awareness” month.
5. Easement and Covenant Agreement for the Los Altos Community Center Project (California Water Service Company): The City Council authorized the City Manager to execute an Easement and Covenant Agreement between the City of Los Altos and California Water Service Company for the Los Altos Community Center project.
6. Review and Adopt 2020 City Council Priorities Workplans: The City Council adopted the 2020 City Council Strategic Priorities Workplan. These priorities include those projects which the Council has chosen to focus on for the coming year.
7. Consideration of a policy, order, resolution or ordinance prohibiting/discouraging commercial and/or residential evictions: The City Council took no further action based on action taken prior to the meeting by the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors which prohibits evictions based on circumstances surrounding COVID-19 for the entire County.
8. Consideration of an ordinance tolling the process and approval of land use applications: The City Council took no action and determined to wait for a response from the Governor's Office to a letter submitted by the League of California Cities requesting relief from certain State requirements, including processing of housing applications.

9. Emergency Measures for Addressing COVID-19: The City Council received an update from the City Manager on measures taken thus far to address the spread of COVID-19.
