## Standards — Tree Board or Department —



- Professional forester/arborist, entire forestry department, or a tree board
- Develop and administer tree management program
- Part of CAAP





### **Standards** — Tree Care Ordinance



- Establishes board and gives responsibilities
- Guidance for planting, maintaining, and removing trees on public property





### Standards — Budget



- Annual budget of at least \$2 per capital
- Tree planting, equipment rental, maintenance, etc.





### Standards — Arbor Day



Opportunity to inform and engage the community through:

- Tree planting
- Education
- Community events
