Los Altos Environmental Commission

Project Accomplishments 2009-2010

Prepared for Joint City Council Study Session - October 19, 2010

Environmental Commission Goals approved by the City Council in June 2009 and progress to date.

Goal #1: Work with staff to secure the best value in waste management services value for Los Altos.

Progress / Accomplishments:

- Waste contract vendor has been awarded; weekly pickup, new services, flat rates, diversion rate contracted at 78%. Committee included Environmental Commission Chair Steve Anderson.
- Two Special Environmental Commission meetings held to present RFP to public in August 2009.
- Eight staff reports presented to Commission from June 2009 to March 2010.

Goal #2: Implement approved education and outreach programs to achieve natural resource conservation for Los Altos.

Progress / Accomplishments:

Waste Management Contract:

- Two MTWS progress reports presented to Commission in April 2010 and June 2010.
- MTWS Special Presentation for public held as part of August 2010 EC meeting; approximately 175 community members attended.
- Links to MTWS site on LA Home page and LAEC home page and recycling page.

Water Conservation:

- Educational material created for water conservation, including FAQs, now posted on LAEC web site.
- Los Altos nominated for Water Conservation award for reduced municipal water use.
- Several reports on water usage received by Commission, including [1] Los Altos Demonstration Gardens (Aug 2009); educational materials placed on website; [2] Santa Clara Valley Water District (SCVWD) and Los Altos Water District water conservation results (Nov 2009), [3] SCVWD mandatory 15% water reductions, model landscaping ordinance and gray water ordinance (Dec 2009), and [4] city participation in Water-Wise program for City Hall (May 2010).

Sustainable Events:

- Presentation on Sustainable event waste management in Feb 2010.
- Events guide from GTLA placed on LAEC web site.

Reusable Shopping Bags:

- Received report on efforts of other municipalities in regards to re-usable bags (Nov 2009).
- Received report from Chamber of Commerce on "Got Bags" program in May 2010. Project to introduce "Got Bags" materials approved by Council to in June 2010. Chamber of Commerce President and EC Chair visited 7 Los Altos grocery stores to raise awareness of re-usable bags. All have established programs in their stores.

 Earth Day Event: Partnered with Acterra and GTLA on Earth-Day events in Redwood Grove and at Los Altos library (April 2010)

Goal #3: Develop baselines and progress indicators for Los Altos usage of water, waste, energy, and greenhouse gases (GHG):

Progress / Accomplishments:

- <u>Water</u>: In June 2009, Council approved Environmental Commission resolution for voluntary water conservation. 2004 selected as base year. Each Cal Water monthly bill now shows a "Water Budget," calculated as 2004 consumption 15%. Two staff reports received and sent to Council to support this resolution.
- <u>Waste</u>: Baseline diversion rate of 54% established by GTLA report. Diversion rates contracted at 78% in new waste management contract; metrics monitoring included in new contract.
- Energy: baseline established as part of GHG inventory. See item #4. Received ICLEI report for Municipal GHG Inventory baseline (Sep 2009).
- Greenhouse Gas (GHG): Community baseline completed as part of GHG inventory. See Item #4 (May 2010).

Goal #4: Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Inventories

Progress / Accomplishments:

- Municipal Operations GHG inventory report completed by staff (ICLEI Report).
- Community GHG inventory report completed by Environmental Commission and received by City Council.
- Council approval to model potential GHG reduction strategies, costs, and payback, and recommend
 those with the most positive impact for our city. We anticipate that community outreach and
 education will comprise the largest part of that Community GHG reduction plan.

Other goals as directed by City Council

City Council goals for 2010 include the following: "Assign Environmental Commission task of developing an Environmental Element to the General Plan."

Progress / Accomplishments:

• <u>Feb 2010</u>: Report received from City Planning Services Manager David Kornfield (March 2010). He recommended holding off on this while his department does some preliminary work.
