SUMMARY:

On March 11, 2008, the City Council authorized the development of conceptual plans for Rosita Park. Two architectural firms, Hansen McArdle, Inc. and Reckord MacLeod, were hired to work with the community and the Parks, Arts and Recreation Commission (PARC) to develop the plans. At the April 10, 2008 Special Meeting of the PARC, with input from user groups and neighbors, a list of amenities was created by the PARC, which specifically included "play elements" rather than a "play structure." The architecture firms were directed to develop plans that took into consideration the list of amenities the PARC had created.

At the March 10, 2010 meeting, the PARC approved a recommendation to design a non-prescribed, nature-based play area suitable for two twelve-year-olds. A play area that would serve special-needs children was also included in the discussion.

On March 24, 2010, two commissioners met with the landscape architect, and staff to review their suggested design options. The main design was to include a multi-faceted structure manufactured by EVOS. During that meeting, several concerns were expressed by the commissioners. The commissioners were concerned that the PARC would not have a say in the final selection since only these two commissioners were being asked to choose and approve choices from preselected designs. Also, the options were "structures" not "elements" which the PARC had approved in their list of amenities at the April 8, 2008 meeting. The commissioners were told that the decision was needed as soon as possible.

In May 2010, three PARC commissioners, along with staff and the architect, toured a playground site in Mountain View to look at an existing EVOS structure. This structure was virtually the same structure as the one presented at the March 24, 2010 PARC meeting. All three commissioners reiterated their concerns about moving forward with this structure without any input from the rest of the PARC. At the November 10, 2010 meeting, the commissioners indicated they wanted all possible play elements under consideration presented separately, specifying age range, cost and adjacency requirements clearly marked. This would help to select a design that would meet the project objectives and budget.

Further deliberation on Rosita playground equipment was then suspended until October 2011, as there was a request from the Los Altos School District to participate in the planning of Rosita Park. When no further changes to the playground were made, City staff brought the playground equipment back to PARC for consideration.

On October 12, 2011, at a Special Meeting, PARC met at Rosita Park to review the playground structure design, which had previously been presented to the subcommittee in March 2010 and May 2010 meetings. At the immediately following regular meeting of PARC on October 12, 2011 the Commission was asked to select 1) a choice of color for the main EVOS structure, 2) a second element such as a climbing structure, and 3) if budget allowed, one additional piece of equipment. Staff stressed that the park is nearly otherwise completed, and that there is urgency to selecting the playground equipment in order to open the playground in the spring.

DISCUSSION:

Color: PARC and the City Council have in recent years, favored using the green and tan color scheme for playground structures in Los Altos in order to create a consistent appearance across City parks.

PARC reviewed three different color choices in addition to the green and tan, as per attached documents. The architect favored the silver, red and yellow color scheme and explained how the color choice echoed many of the colors used in structures surrounding the playground. PARC then discussed how the silver metal color appears most harmonious with the nearby grey buildings at Covington School, the new grey and green restroom building, and the black metal fencing around the tennis courts. Additionally, the primary accent colors highlight the blue tennis courts and green fields without getting lost against them.

Ultimately, PARC voted to support to highlight the surrounding colors within and adjacent to the park, rather than continuing with the green and tan traditional color in this location. The silver, red, and yellow choice was considered to be most aesthetically pleasing in the space and was thus chosen over the more neutral green and tan color choice.

Additional Play Element:

Based on budget considerations and the previous 2010 meetings with PARC, the architect and City staff recommended the choice of the Pinnacle rock structure as the second element in the playground. This structure was chosen as a way of introducing a nature-based element. Photographs and prices were presented for several other options to PARC, including two other rock structures. Discussion included concerns that the Pinnacle structure varied too much in appearance from the contemporary look of the EVOS structure, that it was already in existence at Heritage Oaks Park, and that the Jungle Park rock structures appeared more interesting. Some commissioners favored various other play elements, but consensus was not achieved on any of the others. PARC voted ultimately to recommend the Lions Head as the second play element.

Based on the figures presented, there was not any clear additional budget for a third play element and thus PARC did not make any further selections. There was discussion as to whether a second play element should even be placed at this time, as the rock structures varied from \$20,000 installed to \$23,000 plus installation. Some discussion was given to waiting on this decision in order to choose another more contemporary element at a later time, or to use the money toward different surfacing materials than fibar for increased wheelchair accessibility. However, some commissioners raised the information presented by staff at the tour indicating a need to make selections quickly in order to stay on schedule with a spring playground opening. Thus, PARC voted to proceed with the above recommendations of the EVOS and the Lions Head rock structures.


FISCAL IMPACT:

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. Choose and install the EVOS structure in a different color scheme.
- 2. Choose and install an alternate play element than the Lions Head Jungle Rock for the second piece of equipment.
- 3. Install only the EVOS structure at this time, with consideration in the future for a different second element than the currently shown options.
- 4. Install only the EVOS structure at this time, using the remaining funds toward alternative surfacing such as poured-in-place or other accessible surfaces.
- 5. Forego the EVOS structure and install play elements with a more nature-based appearance.







